

11. CO-CURRICULAR STUDIES

The components of a training programme are usually spelt out in terms of the curriculum. BGST endeavours to enrich the learning experience of students through both formal and non-formal learning. In our Co-Curricular Studies programme we incorporate the following:

11.1 SPECIAL LECTURES

Our resident lecturers will periodically give public lectures to introduce the general Christian public to issues facing the Church and the individuals within society. These lectures also open up the theological disciplines to laity, enabling them to understand better their need for training. We also invite distinguished guest lecturers to deliver Public Lectures.

11.2 CHURCH-BASED COURSES

We bring non-credit courses to churches, courses which are often a distillation of our more popular regular courses, with the aim of introducing BGST to the leadership as well as the membership. Students sometimes decide to come and take our regular courses for credit after they have attended these church-based courses.

11.3 EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVES

Our Co-Curricular programme enables us to seize opportunities to work with other organizations to sponsor special speakers. We are constantly looking for new ways to bring our training to the churches and to laity in general.
